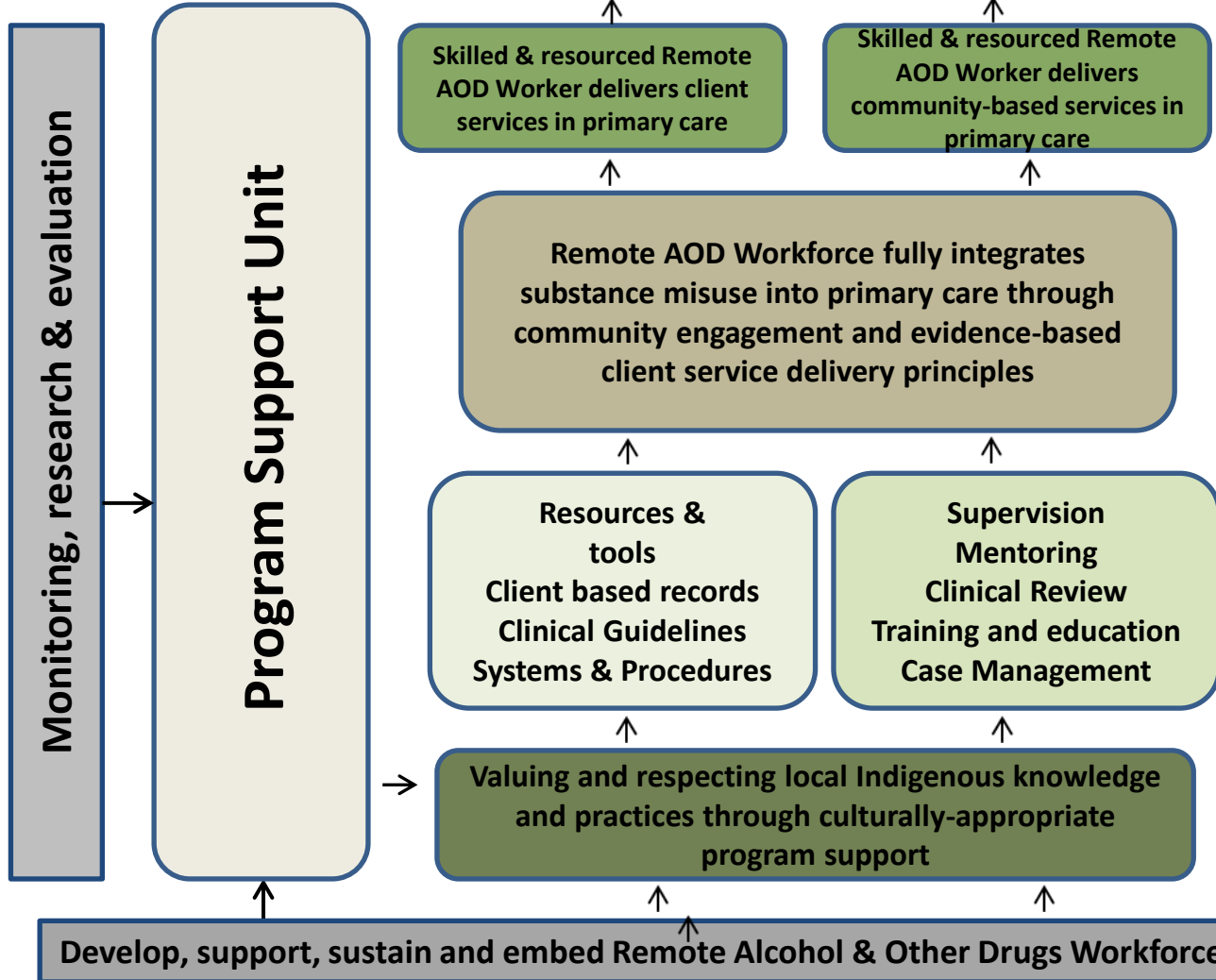


A healthy, autonomous approach to AOD in remote Indigenous communities to reduce the harms of substance misuse



Long term outcomes by 2022

- All communities have access to skilled & resourced AOD services within Primary Health Care
- Ongoing funding is secured
- RAODW Program is accredited

Medium term outcomes Mid 2017

- Management of AOD is a core component of primary health care service delivery
- Remote AOD resources are adopted across the NT,
- Client satisfaction is routinely measured and integrated into CQI
- Client data is recorded and audited for CQI purposes
- Model / outcomes are published

Short term outcomes Mid 2016

- 90% of positions are filled
- All workers are engaged in training
- Reporting framework is established
- Agreed PSU model for TEHS CAHS
